Student Opportunity & Achievement Record (SOAR)

SOAR is a place for students to record their superpowers! It is an official college record that helps students tell the story of out of classroom skills and experiences (their superpowers) that can assist them as they seek future employment, further studies or other opportunities!

SOAR includes opportunities, activities, and experiences completed through the College including Work Integrated Learning (WIL) and on campus work and volunteerism. These experiences are verified by a college employee, so it's all official!

You can use SOAR when you are:

- Applying for jobs
- Planning for further education
- Preparing for interviews

Add an Activity to SOAR:

Follow these steps to add to your Student Opportunity and Achievement Record (SOAR):

- 1. Click here to access CareerQuest Hub.
- 2. Once you log in, select **Student Opportunity & Achievement Record (SOAR)** from the left-hand side bar.
- 3. Select Add to My SOAR.
- 4. Once you have completed an activity (not while you are still participating), request to add that activity within 2 weeks of completing it.
- 5. An activity validator will review your request within 2 weeks of submission and approve your request.
- 6. The activity will appear on your SOAR once validated! Share your SOAR with employers or add to your applications, either by printing or including a link.

<u>Please note:</u> The Student Opportunity & Achievement record can include approved activities from July 1, 2022 and onward. Activities from before this date are not eligible.

SOAR Categories

Each activity will be categorized into one of the following:



LEADERSHIP Activities that support NorQuest learners to develop, grow or maintain their personal and professional leadership skills and competencies.

- Peer Mentor
- RBC Student Ambassador
- SANQC Executive or Council Members
- Student Societies or Leadership/Governance Councils



PERSONAL AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT Activities that support NorQuest learners to develop, grow or maintain personal and professional knowledge, skills and attitudes.

- Business Case Competition
- Workshops
- Conferences
- Non-Credit Courses or other programs that increase personal or professional competency



THE LEARNER EXPERIENCE Activities that support NorQuest learners to engage in campus or campus-sponsored activities that promote skill or competency development, growth or maintenance.

• Campus co-curricular engagement activities such as e-sports



VOLUNTEERISM AND SERVICE Activities where NorQuest learners engage in acts of volunteerism or service on campus or campussponsored activities that promote skill or competency development, growth or maintenance.

- Orientation Lead
- Career Fair Volunteer
- Business Conference Volunteer



Frequently Asked Questions:

1. What are the timelines for making a request?

We encourage students to apply to have their activity included on their record as soon as they complete the activity, usually within two weeks.

Note: You <u>must</u> apply to have your SOAR activities recorded for the academic year (July 1 to June 30) by June 25 annually.

4. How long will I have access to SOAR after I graduate?

Students will have access to SOAR for two years after graduation.
