The NorQuest College (college) Withdrawal Policy governs student- and college-initiated program and course withdrawals. Authority to establish this policy is derived from the NorQuest College Board of Governors Policy No. 5, which delegates authority to the President and CEO to establish policies and procedures for the college's management and operation. Policy: The college recognizes that a student may choose to withdraw from a program or course before or during studies. The college also reserves the right to withdraw a student from a program or course in the event that it is clearly demonstrated that student responsibilities have not been met. The college publishes a schedule in its Academic Calendar to describe the

Academic Calendar: an annual publication of academic regulations, academic dates, programs of study, and course descriptions. The NorQuest College website is the official source of Academic Calendar information.

academic and financial consequences of withdrawals. These consequences are based on the amount of time that has elapsed in each course as of the

Withdrawal: discontinuation of enrolment in a course or program which may be initiated either by the student or by the college. Reasons for withdrawal include, but are not limited to, student choice, academic misconduct, medical, or non-payment of fees.
