Protect yourself from scams

- Never deal in cash.
- Never rent sight-unseen.
- Don't provide confidential info that can be used for identity theft.
- Meet the landlord in person.
- Conduct basic research.
- Be aware of too-good-to-be-true rent rates.
- Be aware of high-pressure sales tactics.
- Be aware of landlords who request little info about you.
- Ask for a written lease.
- Ensure the written lease identifies the owner or management company.
- Consider renting from property management companies.
