

# Singhmar Centre for Learning

Edmonton's front door to educational and economic opportunities



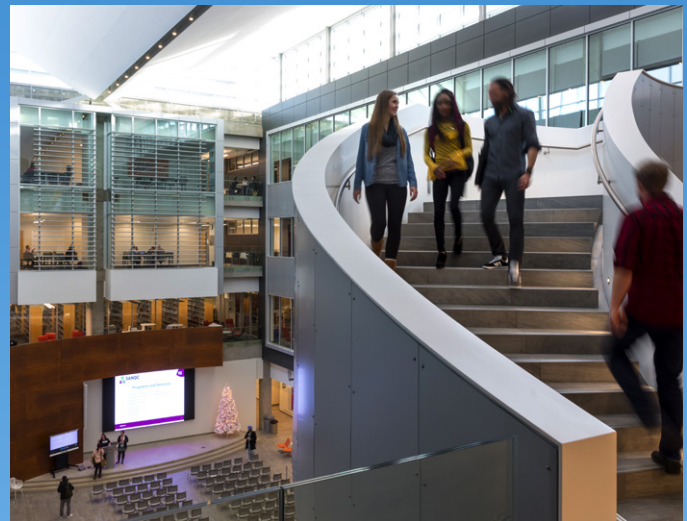
NorQuest College has begun a new chapter in its history with the opening of the Singhmar Centre for Learning in 2017. The new building sits at the heart of Edmonton's downtown Education District shared by MacEwan University, the University of Alberta, and other institutions, whose combined student population is expected to reach 50,000 by 2020.

This new building is LEED Silver-certified and supports the consolidation of NorQuest's dispersed Edmonton facilities into a single downtown campus. It also enables the college to accommodate growing student demand while continuing to deliver workforce relevant programs in student-centred settings.

Singhmar Centre for Learning features include:

- 24 classrooms and 26 labs
- The 1000 Women Child Care Centre, a child care facility with space for 56 children
- An Indigenous student centre, complete with a ceremonial room
- New food outlets and student activity spaces
- Underground parking for 107 vehicles and 73 bicycles

The Government of Alberta has committed to a \$170 million grant for the \$192 million campus expansion project. This includes construction of the Singhmar Centre for Learning, renovating the Heritage Tower, and adding green space to our campus. Additional funding is being raised by NorQuest College through Maximizing Opportunities: The NorQuest Campaign.
