Program Overview

NorQuest College's Justice diploma program is an interdisciplinary program that allows students to gain skills and knowledge across the spectrum of the justice field. It is a unique offering in the Edmonton region and in Alberta. The program offers broad education in the justice field that leads directly to a career as well as university transfer courses for laddering opportunities to university. Students will select from a variety of electives that are linked to areas such as diversity and inclusion, Indigenous justice, youth justice, law enforcement, and corrections.

Career Potential

While policing and corrections are highly desirable occupations, the skills taught in this program would allow graduates to work in a variety of roles covering a wide spectrum of employment opportunities. There are many careers that a graduate of the Justice diploma program can pursue and many of these would be direct entry with a two-year diploma.

Graduates with a two-year diploma can pursue positions in justice-related fields such as protective services and security; peace officers; case workers and community resources; police clerks and emergency services; and legal services.

Admission Requirements

- Language Arts – this requirement can be met with any of the following, or an equivalent course:
 - 60% in English Language Arts 30-1 or 70% in English Language Arts 30-2
 - 60% in [ESLG 1860](#) or 70% in [ESLG 1898](#)

ELP Requirements

If English is your second language, you must provide proof of ELP prior to admission. ELP test results must have been obtained within two years of the start date of your program.

Acceptable evidence of ELP may be one of the following test scores:

- IELTS Academic: 6.5; no section score below 6
- TOEFL iBT: 84; no section score below 21
- CELPIP General: 8; no section score below 7
- CAEL: 70; no section score below 70
- Duolingo: 115
- minimum of:
 - 80% in [ESLS 8000](#) or [ESLS 8100](#), and 80% in [ESLW 8000](#) or [ESLW 8100](#); or
 - 50% in [ESLG 1898](#) and [ESLG 1899](#)
 - 50% in [ESLG 1860](#) and [ESLG 1861](#)
