Transitions to Employment

Program Overview

This 10-month program is designed to provide employment preparation training for adults with mild developmental disabilities. Our post-secondary setting enables learners to further their education beyond high school to transition to the workforce.

Through a combination of classroom and workplace instruction, you will acquire training on current equipment, an understanding of current workplace practices, food safety and handling skills, and independent living skills. Your self-confidence and marketable skills will increase while receiving ongoing, intensive support and mentoring from college faculty staff.

Career Potential

Graduates of this program find jobs in a variety of fields, including food service, warehousing, and other service industries. The objective of this program is to provide eligible individuals with training, guidance, and work experience that will contribute directly to their ability to obtain employment and establish and maintain independence.

Admission Requirements

- history of special education (school records, standardized testing, etc.)
- admission interview with a NorQuest College counsellor
- able to participate in a group setting
- able to function independently in class and at the work site
- ready for employment
